Launching in 2024, with funding awarded for 2024 through the Perth County Stewardship Program (PCSP) is a new grant intended to support reforestation, tree planting, forest health, and stewardship opportunities in the County.

The PCSP provides resources and financial assistance to landowners and community groups completing meaningful reforestation and carbon sequestration projects. These projects are essential to Perth County's resiliency, restoration of natural areas and preservation of quality agricultural lands.

**The Forest Health Check-up Stream supports rural woodlot owners to complete a woodlot management plan or a woodlot assessment. Funding is available to rural woodlot owners to cost-share a consultation and woodlot management plan. Eligible applicants may apply for up to 75% to a maximum of \$500.00.**
