

Fact Sheet: Perth County Mobile Integrated Health Team



To support the Urban and Rural communities of Perth County, Perth County Paramedic Services has created the Perth County Mobile Integrated Health Team (MIHT).

This community-based Perth County MIHT team will provide care, support and practical solutions for our most vulnerable populations through direct physician referral, Health System Partner Referral and Paramedic referral programs. This team will be available for in-home visits to persons in the community who are experiencing a lack of health supports, have complex medical needs that require monitoring or whom have been identified as needing help connecting to available community supports. While working in partnership with other invaluable in-home community agencies, the Perth County MIT will be available Monday to Friday to provide assistance to anyone requiring care and support.

The paramedic team works closely with HPPH to provide COVID testing to isolated individuals, as well as the Huron Perth Palliative Care Outreach Team Physicians, and Local Complex Care Physicians to improve the patient experience and prevent unnecessary visits to ER or lengthy hospital readmission.

When to call the Perth County Paramedic Mobile Integrated Health Team:

- A palliative patient does not have a symptom response kit at home and requires associated care.
- To help prevent unnecessary visits to the Emergency Department, for non-life threatening situations.
- An in home COVID-19 swab is required.
- An independent living person is having difficulty managing while waiting for community supports.
